#### Interview with GKV's Comenius Language Assistant Eva-Maria Baumgartner


#### What do you think about Turkish people?

After more than 7 months in Turkey I can say that Turkish people are in general very friendly and open to meeting new people. Wherever I went, people were very curious and asked a lot of questions. As people in Gaziantep are not so used to foreigners in their city, they always wondered who this 'yabancı kız' was. For this reason I had a lot of contact with people. Also Turkish people really fulfill what is said about them: they are very hospitable. I was invited to many families' homes and always enjoyed learning about their culture and private life.

#### When you came to Gaziantep, did you feel lonely or did you miss home?

As I already said, from the very beginning when I first arrived in Gaziantep I met a lot of people who cared about me, invited me to their houses and integrated me into their family life. So I never felt lonely. What I miss about Germany is not being close to my friends and family, and also not being able to take part in the leisure activities there. German people love doing sports outside.





For example, in my university town I always go cycling, skating, jogging or just for a walk along the river side. Also, my friends and I like going out at night. For this reason I am looking forward to going back to my life in Germany now but I will always remember my special time here and all the experiences during this year. I know for sure I will come back to Turkey and feel at home here forever.

#### Why did you come to Turkey? What was your aim? Was it just for travelling?

Well, one day, about one and a half years ago, the idea came to my mind, that related to my studies at University and regarding the fact that I will have a lot of students in the future who speak Turkish at home, so I decided to learn Turkish and come to Turkey. After doing some research I found out about the COMENIUS Programme and I really liked its ideas. The philosophy is to live in another country for a while and be an assistant teacher there at a school to gain some teaching experience. At the same time you can learn about culture, language and traditions. Luckily my application was successful and I got the chance to be at GKV for nine months. Of course I also took the chance and went travelling in Turkey. I am always happy to discover new places and Turkey has a lot of historical places and amazing natural areas to visit.

We were surprised by how close relationships the students and teachers had: they were like another family and made us feel as if we were just at home.

On the weekends, we usually spend our time shopping at Sanko Park, touring around the famous historical fortress, looking at the animals at Gaziantep Zoo and shopping for traditional items at the Bazaar. At Gaziantep Zoo, we first found it hysterical that the monkeys were smoking; however, upon reflection it could be very harmful for the monkeys. We were amazed at the aquarium; it was filled with unique and beautiful sea creatures. We also enjoyed watching the different species of birds flying all around the room. We must say that Gaziantep Zoo was very thrilling and in our opinion; a little bit better than the Columbus Zoo which is listed number one in the top 10 zoos in the United

My experience in Gaziantep has honestly been great so far. This will always be an experience that I will never forget. I really want to thank the teaching staff and the students of Gaziantep Kolej Vakfi for helping me learn about the Turkish culture and the Turkish language. They will always have a special place in my heart.

To keep up-to-date with our constantly-changing world, as the Head of Department I am participating in seminars all over the country whenever possible.






## The 6th Annual ELT Conference
